Federal Government through Establishment Division & others (2018 SCMR 1891)] that the Provincial/Islamabad Bar Councils introduce "Two Week Bar Vocational course" during the six months training/pupillage period that a law graduate intending to join the legal profession must undergo for being enrolled as advocate for practicing law. Provincial/Islamabad Bar Councils may, however, consider and decide modalities for introducing the said course through respective Federal/Provincial Judicial Academies.
