TWO-WEEK VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM FOR LAW GRADUATES (BATCH-04 FROM 30 MARCH – 15 APRIL 2023)



Background Context

The Hon'ble Supreme Court of Pakistan decided in its judgment [Pakistan Bar Council through Chairman & others Vs. Federal Government through Establishment Division & others (2018 SCMR 1891)] that the Provincial/Islamabad Bar Councils introduce a "Two Week Bar Vocational course" during the six-month training/pupillage period that a law graduate intending to join the legal profession must undergo for being enrolled as an advocate for practicing law. Provincial/Islamabad Bar Councils may. however, consider and decide modalities for introducing the said course through respective Federal/Provincial Judicial Academies.

Brief Introduction to Training

❖ In the context above, a Two-Week Vocational Training Program for Law Graduates on procedural laws was arranged from 30 March − 15 April 2023 (Batch-04) at Sindh Judicial Academy. In this interactive/practical training program, a total of 448 Law Graduates attended.
